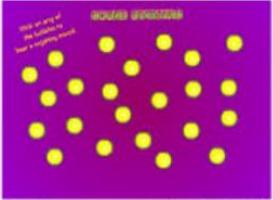




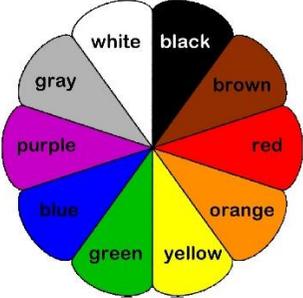

	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);">Physical development</p>	<p><u>Moving and Handling</u></p> <p>Play the ‘Traffic Lights’ game at home. Adult to call out a colour and child to respond with the corresponding movements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Red = stop, stand still • Yellow = move slowly • Green = run (being careful to avoid any obstacles) <p>Fine motor skills: explore playdough using your hands, fingers and tools. See ‘Homemade playdough recipe’ in Nursery Resources.</p>	<p><u>Health and Self-care</u></p> <p>Read (or watch a read out loud on YouTube) ‘Germs are not for sharing’ by Elizabeth Verdick. Talk about the hygiene routines you have at home.</p> <p>Toileting – try to be as independent as possible when using the toilets. Including pulling your own clothing up/down and wiping after using the toilet. Don’t forget to wash your hands!</p>

	<p>Reading</p> <p>Sing along to your favourite Nursery Rhymes. Can you add some actions?</p> 	<p>Writing</p> <p>Enjoy making ‘messy’ marks! Using shaving foam and a flat surface, practise forming shapes, wiggly lines and letters using your finger.</p> 	<p>Phonics</p> <p>Visit the phase 1 section on www.phonicsplay.co.uk. Enjoy playing sound games, talk about what the sounds remind you of and where you might have heard them before.</p>  <p>Sound starters - Click the bubbles to hear different sound effects. Great for: Developing vocabulary for talking about sounds</p>
Mathematics	<p>Numbers</p> <p>Practise counting out loud in sequence to 10.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn and sing the rhyme ‘1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive’ Play hide and seek: the seeker needs to count to 10 first! Listen to counting to 10 songs online. ‘Super Simple Songs’ on YouTube have a variety to choose from. 		<p>Shape, space and measures</p> <p>Complete a puzzle. Try a new or more challenging puzzle, ask a family member to work with you.</p> <p>Explore capacity using different sized containers in water tray or bath. Can you say when the container is ‘full’, ‘empty’ or ‘nearly full’ / ‘nearly empty’.</p>
	Understanding the World	<p>Draw a picture of your family and talk to someone about the representations you have created.</p>
