


Ewell Grove Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our children and expects all staff and visitors to share this commitment.

### PHONICS WORKSHOP FOR PARENTS - ALL YEARS

Phonics is the bedrock of learning to read and spell. Our aim is for all children to crack the phonics code and become fluent readers and spellers. We look forward to you joining Miss Rising and Miss Barnett for this workshop on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October in the school hall at 9:00 am. The workshop will include:

- 1. Introduction to Phonics
- Embedding Phonics to develop writing skills

### READING VOLUNTEERS

- Miss Barnett English Lead and Phase Leader Years 5 & 6
  First point of contact for Reading Volunteers
- Regular reading practising skills: word reading, comprehension, CEWs
- Volunteers will work with the same children/build a relationship (2/3 children)
- Involves recapping sounds individual sounds, digraphs, trigraphs
- Children may repeat the same book throughout the week to develop fluency – word reading and comprehension
- Volunteers to write an observation of progress throughout the week
- Consistent timetable but not in own child's class e.g. ideally two/three times a week




### READING VOLUNTEERS

### How to "read" with children:

We teach the skills of word reading through the Ruth Miskin Read Write Inc phonics programme – sounds (phonemes) and their written representations (graphemes) are taught in a particular order – children learn to blend sounds to read words and gradually become more fluent as they acquire the necessary phonics skills.

- How to use a RWI book
- How long with each child
- Strategies to use:
- phonics first
- praise
- My Turn Your Turn



When reading with the children, you will have access to a Reading Volunteer Pack with all the resources and information you will need to support the children.

Please attend the Phonics Workshop as this will support you when reading with the children.

### CONFIDENTIALITY AND SAFEGUARDING

Before coming into school to help for the first time you will need to read and sign the following documents.

- Read the Guidance Booklet which covers safeguarding, health & Safety and confidentiality
- Read the DFE document 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' (We will provide you with a copy of this)
- Sign to say you have read and understood both documents
- Regular parent volunteers will need to complete the 'Online Disclosure and Barring Service' (DBS) form

# Volunteering at Ewell Grove How to complete a DBS Check?

Prior to commencing, you will need to bring to the school office three original documents such as your passport/driving licence + one other item with proof of address (not phone bill).

The office will take a copy of your documents and you will receive a link via email. Please complete the online DBS form and the school will be notified when this is completed.

If you already have a DBS with the school we will check this is still valid and you can start volunteering week commencing **2**<sup>nd</sup> **October**.

If you do not currently have a valid DBS with Ewell Grove you may start volunteering but this must be within the classroom and under the supervision of the Class Teacher.
